

"That is very generous of you, Ty Brooks, but it will be very dangerous," warned Sari.


"First we should get out of this mist. We should try to get to a town or something."



Huge measles outbreak-biggest since 1996!

Measles. I thought they were totally gone now. But it looks like they're coming back.

Measles is a disease common in children that causes a runny nose, cough, fever, and rash all over the body. Although it's usually children, 52% of the cases in the U.S. are people 20 or over, says the CDC. The age range of the victims is from 2 to 65.




It was eradicated from the U.S. in 2000, but it's back now. It is common in Europe, Asia, and Africa. Worldwide, there are 122,000 measles deaths per year. There have been no reported deaths here yet, but people have been hospitalized. There have been 288 cases of measles in the U.S. between January 1st and May 23rd- that's the highest number of cases in the first 5 months of a year since 1194.

Why? Dr. Anne Schuchat (Assistant Surgeon and director of CDC's National Center for immunizations and respiratory diseases) says that most of the cases come from people who are unvaccinated and bring the disease back from another country. In the Philippines, there have been 32,000 cases and 41 deaths since January! Half of the U.S. cases originated there. On Thursday, the CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) said that it has spread to 18 states, although the largest outbreak was in an Amish community in Ohio. 97% of the cases have been linked to places in 18 other countries.

85% of U.S. citizens aren't vaccinated, and health authorities are telling healthcare providers that they should recommend the vaccine to their patients. Some people are against vaccines, sometimes for religious reasons. Others think its a good and easy way to stop disease from spreading and from getting it ourselves.
