

Flora Sezunda: Being the Magickal Mishaps of a Girl of Spirit, Der Glass-Gazing Sidekick, Two Ominous Butlers (One Blue), a Douse with Eleven Thousand Rooms, and a Red Oog by Ysabeau S. Wilce Published 2007

This book is fantasy.

Flora Fyrdraaca's family, along with their house, was once grand but now has fallen upon hard times. When Flora's mother banished the family's magical butler long ago the house, and the family started to fall apart. The Fyrdraaca family have been in the military for generations and Flora's mother and Flora's older sister are always far away working for the military, leaving Flora at home with Poppy (Flora's father) who retired from the military after being captured in a war, and now stays confined in his room, drinking and occasionally coming downstairs to get food.

Flora's house, Crackpot Hall, is huge and has a lot of rooms to clean, and without the help of a butler or maid, it falls to Flora to do all the housework.

Flora thinks her life is miserable, what with Poppy and chores and school. And on top of it all, very soon, when she turns 14 she will go to the barracks to be trained in the military. Flora doesn't want to be in the military, but she doesn't really have a choice. That's just what Fyrdraaca's do. Flora wants to be a ranger. Stealthy, brave, resourceful, powerful, and a worker of magic. Flora's mother doesn't approve of magic. She says it's a shortcut. She doesn't approve of shortcuts either.

But one day, Flora takes a shortcut and discovers a secret room and the banished butler, Valefor. But things are not always what they seem.

I would recommend this book to all fantasy lovers. Probably most enjoyable for ages 10 and up.


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Cooking Page

Chocolate chip oatmeal cookies

Recipe adapted from the Joy of Cooking by Amy Syverson

Recipe Makes 3 1/2 dozen 3 inch cookies

Position rack in upper third of oven. Preheat oven to 350 degrees fahrenheit. Grease cookie sheets.

Whisk these ingredients together thoroughly:

1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

Optional:

½ tsp. ground cinnamon

½ tsp. ground nutmeg

Beat these ingredients on a medium speed until well blended:

½ pound (2 sticks) unsalted butter, softened

1 1/2 pound packed light or dark brown sugar

2 large eggs

2 1/2 tsp. vanilla

Stir flour mixture into butter mixture until well blended and smooth.

Then stir in:

1 cup of chocolate chips

3 cups of quick oats (or normal oats grinded on medium fine)

Drop the dough by heaping measuring tablespoonfuls onto the sheets, spacing about 3 inches apart. With lightly greased hands, lightly press the cookies down to form 1/2-inch-thick rounds.

Bake, 1 sheet at a time, until the cookies are lightly browned all over and almost firm when lightly pressed in the center of the top, 6 to 9 minutes; rotate the sheet halfway through baking for even browning. Remove the sheet to a rack and let stand until the cookies firm slightly, about 2 minutes. Transfer the cookies to racks to cool.

Chemical spill in West Virginia

On the 9th of January, a company called Freedom Industries had a one inch leak in one of their storage tanks and spilled a chemical called methylcycyclohexane methanol(MCHM) into the Elk river near Charleston, West Virginia. It is a chemical used for coal mining. Not much is known about it or its health effects. The company was 1.5 miles up river from the water treatment plant and so it got into the water easily. The spill was first noticed when people reported smelling licorice. The people in and near Charleston were told not to drink their tap water, use it to wash dishes or clothes, or bathe in it. Stores were practically out of bottled water.

A few people were hospitalized because they showed symptoms of being sick from drinking the water, and many, many other people have called poison control to ask if they might be sick.

On January 13, people were told that the chemical had dropped to 1 part per million and was therefore safe to drink, although pregnant women were advised not to drink the water at all until the chemical is completely undetectable. However, many people are still suspicious because they can smell the it. Some doctors are also advising that children shouldn't drink it either.

Then, shortly after the spill, Freedom Industries filed for bankruptcy. Some sources suspect that they may have done it to avoid lawsuits.

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
